My time as President has lead the way for huge personal growth and as a training organization, the Junior League has afforded me skills that I will undoubtedly carry in other areas of my life. I want to thank the League and its members for the leadership skills, comradery, friendships, sense of community and volunteerism I have been presented through these years as an active member. While there were a few hard lessons to be learned along the way, they all have had a part in shaping the woman I am today.

The 2022-2023 year was our first full active year back from the pandemic and we sure were a busy bunch. We kicked our year off with a diaper drive in conjunction with our community partner Allied Foundation and were able to secure close to 10,000 diapers for families in need. We donated 150 Thanksgiving baskets to families on Long Island and donated back packs for children in need. Later in the year, we built an add-on structure and helped revitalize the playground at Belmont Childcare's Anna House. We brought back our most beloved program Positively Me, where we created a safe space to teach young women the importance of identifying unhealthy relationships, the importance of self -care and good nutrition. We had a host of other projects as well and all were a success.

This year was also one of our most successful fundraising years in recent memory. We were given the opportunity to partner with Kendra Scott and we were hosted at Tory Burch in the Americana for Champions for Charity. Our amazing Halloween Fundraiser featured a huge sing along to Rappers Delight with a surprise guest appearance by Wonder Mike of the Sugar Hill Gang. We had a retro roller-skating fundraiser where I ripped all the cartilage in my arm, and I would do it again (skating not ripping my cartilage)!!!Our Thrift Shop located in the heart of Roslyn reopened to its full-time schedule after being decimated by hurricane Ida. Redesigned and reimagined, the thrift shop is enjoying its biggest gains to date, helping us to fulfill our mission and promote programs in our communities.

Our year was so busy and there was so much more we accomplished. My heart is full. I want to thank my board for their hard work this year and for their unwavering support and guidance. Our board, our members and community partners' dedication helped make the 2022-2023 year, one to remember.

WOMEN BUILDING BETTER COMMUNITIES




DIAPER DRIVE

For Diaper Awareness Week, we collaborated with the Allied Foundation to distribute more than 9,200 diapers to families in need on Long Island. As an organization, we not only surpassed our initial goal of providing 2,000 diapers but also achieved this remarkable feat thanks to our incredible volunteers, partners. the Thrift Shop, and our supportive community. It was a privilege to offer assistance to families facing challenges in affording an adequate supply of diapers and to raise awareness about diaper scarcity issues across Long Island. We extend our heartfelt appreciation to Heather Edwards, Executive Director of the Allied Foundation, for her dedicated efforts in advocating for diaper security and for joining forces with The Junior League of Long Island in this noble cause.

THANKSGIVING BASKETS

PROM BOUTIQUE

The Junior League of Long Island collaborated with the Long Island Volunteer Center for their yearly Prom Boutique Project. This boutique offered a range of new and gently used prom attire, including dresses, suits, and accessories like formal footwear. evening bags, dress shirts, belts, ties, and costume jewelry, to over 343 registered students hailing from more than 50 high schools and at-risk youth agencies. All of these items were provided entirely free of charge. This event presented a wonderful opportunity for these young individuals to exude confidence and elegance on their memorable night, while simultaneously alleviating the financial strain on their families.



WOMEN'S DIVERSITY NETWORK

JLLI members enthusiastically engaged in volunteer work during the Women's Diversity Network's Annual Diversity Summit. These volunteers took on roles as room captains for a series of insightful workshops led by keynote speakers. Additionally, they manned information tables to promote the Junior League's mission within the Long Island community, focusing on serving women and children in Nassau and Suffolk counties.

PAJAMA PROGRAM

We assembled approximately 65 gift packages containing new pajamas, books, and vibrant socks for children at one of the shelters we support on Long Island. Subsequently, three of our dedicated Junior League volunteers met with the children to hand out these packages and shared quality time reading books together. We are genuinely thrilled to provide this modest yet meaningful gift to the children currently residing there, and we consider it a privilege to bring smiles to their charming faces during that special afternoon.



HEADQUARTERS & SHOP UPDATES



Following our grand opening on April 30th 2022, the Junior League of Long Island Thrift Shop has had its most historic sales year on record for the period July 2022 - June 2023. Our operations were reimagined and we successfully instituted a Thursday - Sunday operation which has resulted in record sales and community buzz. Throughout the year the Shop staff along with volunteers not only worked hard, but also created many memorable moments among themselves and our loyal customers and donors. Christopher Cooper has been instrumental in rebranding and refreshing our beloved Thrift Shop which we all know is the biggest fundraising initiative of the Jr. League of Long Island. He has created five remarkable window displays and in-store merchandising experiences that have continued to surprise and awe us all. Under his guidance we have moved forward refining the Thrift Shop standards, allowing us to operate at a higher level in donation intake, pricing and customer service. Chris, along with our staff, have successfully made the Thrift Shop the place to be for customers and League members alike!

The Thrift Shop Committee has put in place more ways to involve our customers in our mission-based activities through in-store promotions and advertising. With the help of our round-up campaign we have given over \$2,800 to the local Eagle Scouts, Prom Boutique, Allied Foundation and Project Toy. Our round-up donations have also increased over 250% since our reopening before the flood repair work.

In times of donations beyond expectations, we have expanded our partners to include The Book Fairies for gently used books and magazines, Big Brothers Big Sisters, St. Vincent DePaul, The Salvation Army and WeAREable, thus furthering the impact we make across Long Island. The Thrift Shop has hosted three community partner shopping events for members of the Roslyn Chamber of Commerce and The Atria Assisted Living as well as families from Help Me Grow. Three Thrift Shop socials were also hosted before our monthly General Membership Meetings where League members were able to shop, meet their donation quotas and schedule donation hours as well as mingle with fellow League members. Our members have volunteered hundreds of hours working in the Shop, assisting with donation intake, maintenance of our showroom, and customer engagement to create the warm welcoming environment that has helped us succeed. On June 3rd the Thrift Shop and Fundraiser Committees hosted the annual Spring Fair after a year off due to flood repairs from hurricane Ida. 22 Vendors joined the Thrift Shop "Fill a Bag Sale" in the parking lot for a day of good sales and community outreach.

The maintenance and overall upkeep of the store and house continue to be a priority for us all even after last year's interior renovation. We are still planning to continue improving our Headquarters with two additional projects. Chatel Construction handled our final exterior door repair and fire escape on the driveway side, and Maccarone Plumbing provided us with a brand-new HVAC Unit to replace a previously installed 25-yearold model. As we come up to close out the master capital improvement plans for 2023 - 2024, we hope to complete a second floor refresh of our League meeting and office spaces, as well as a much-needed repair and repaint of the building's exterior facade which has been largely untouched since the initial 1960s renovation.



Since its inception in 1951, the Thrift Shop, funded by donations, has evolved into a renowned retail gem and stands as the non-profit organization's most significant annual fundraising endeavor. Current JLLI President Cristine Bruno expresses gratitude, saying, "We couldn't have done this without the love and support of the community that we look forward to serving!" All the profits generated by the store are channeled into supporting community service projects that benefit women and children on Long Island.



ALICIA AGUILERA MEMORIAL FUND & RONALD MCDONALD HOUSE



On March 26, 2021, the Junior League of Long Island experienced the painful loss of Alicia Aguilera, a dedicated member who had actively served for over 13 years. Alicia's sudden and profound departure left our organization and the wider community deeply saddened. In her memory, Alicia's family graciously requested that donations be directed to the Junior League of Long Island. While we already recognized Alicia's exceptional nature, the profound impact she had on people's lives was evident in the incredible generosity that poured in, resulting in donations exceeding \$26,000. One of Alicia's cherished memories was overseeing our yearly Brunch at The Ronald McDonald House. She derived immense joy from witnessing the smiles on the faces of the resident families as they beheld the bountiful brunch spread. Consequently, it felt entirely fitting to establish a room in Alicia's honor at the Ronald McDonald House.

In November and in June, we were excited to resume our tradition of personally preparing dinner and desserts at the Ronald McDonald House for the families currently residing there. We eagerly anticipated the opportunity to come together as volunteers, marking the first time in two years that we can do so. McDonald House








MEMBER ACTIVITIES & TRAINING

TRAININGS

Lynn's organization is a grassroots non-profit dedicated to raising awareness about challenging issues such as sex trafficking, internet exploitation of minors, and digital safety measures to protect our children from victimization.



BOOK CLUB

Now in its eighth year, the JLLI Book Club is going strong! The group continued to meet on the fourth Monday of each month on Zoom. The virtual format, which we started using in 2020, has made coming together much easier, especially for some of our far-flung members. The goal of this group is to bring together anyone interested in gardening so we can help each other by asking questions, sharing resources, and trading seeds/plants. Meetings are held every few weeks via Zoom to ask and answer questions, share updates, and learn from one another.

day at the Peconic River Herb Farm in
Calverton. More trips will be planned soon

COMMUNITY SERVICE FUND

Annually, The Junior League of Long Island allocates funds generated from our fundraising initiatives to support local non-profit organizations on Long Island through our Community Service Fund. Each organization interested in receiving funding submits an application to our Community Service Fund Committee, which subsequently assesses the applications and determines the recipients. These recipients have the opportunity to receive up to \$2,500 to assist in financing their community programs.

Allied Foundation: Our funds will support their Potty Independence Initiative, which help families with toddlers 2-3 years of age who struggle to afford the high cost of pull-up diapers and give toddlers the tools to help them build the bridge to potty independence, as well as their Period Project dedicated to support those who cannot afford the basic products required to manage their menstrual health. Specifically, our award will help them enhance their existing efforts by expanding their potty independence initiative with 100 potty kits and our period project with 100 pairs of period underwear.

Belmont Child Care Association, Inc.: Our award will help fund their Children's Movement Program, which helps their students improve fine motor skills, social skills and listening skills. Their lacrosse program with the New York Riptide will run over the summer months as a clinic series for their school- age program and we are funding a portion of the expense to purchase of any necessary equipment. We will also help fund their summer virtual dance and yoga classes for toddlers - school age.

The Book Fairies, Inc.: Our award will help fund their Long Island public bookshelves project, which increases book access Island-wide by supplying, maintaining, and refreshing book collections at public parks, LIRR stations, grocery stores, pediatric doctors' offices, health centers, before and after-school programs, transitional housing, food pantries, women's shelters, and community centers, especially targeting communities who have lacked access to books and face barriers in providing high quality and age-appropriate books for their children. They will allocate 75% of the funds to key project staff and 25% to the space where we sort books for this project. Our award will enable the distribution of 3,500 books to Long Islanders.

CYO of Long Island: Our award will be used to establish a Junior League of Long Island Scholarship Program that will allow 16 children, whose families are struggling financially, to

Scholarship Program that will allow 16 children, whose families are struggling financially, to participate in a season of athletic, social or academic activity thanks to a \$150 scholarship per child. \$100 will be used for administrative costs.

One World Girl: Funds will support the continuation and expansion of their signature program, The Changemakers Council, that serves 25-30 young women in 7th - 12th grade. When girls join The Changemakers Council, they make a substantial commitment of time and energy to participate in all of the year-long council program elements. The funds from JLLI will be used for the yearly costs of program materials, art supplies, curriculum development, workshop speakers, Broadway tickets and other creative outings, food, travel, staff, office expenses and a small budget for each council member to cover expenses incurred during their Take Action projects, specifically the costs to implement the Long Island-based projects.

<u>Lynn's Warriors:</u> Our award will be used for community outreach focused on digital safety. This includes tutorials, lectures, and Warrior Workshop presentations to concerned parents and caregivers, organizations, and schools. Our funds will help cover travel expenses, presentation materials, handouts, and Warrior swag.

Women's Diversity Network: Our award will help fund their Youth Justice Leadership Program, a 7-month long virtual program for students in grades 9-12. This program, designed to inspire students to become leaders and active changemakers. Students develop skills and knowledge that are not taught in traditional classrooms, earn community service hours, meet and build friendships with other young people, and develop leadership skills in a fun, exciting way that helps them at school, in their community, and in their future careers. Specifically, our funding toward this program will provide 25 youth with a unique leadership development opportunity and will cover program administration, facilitators, guest speakers, stipends for student-led projects, awards, and travel expenses for youth leaders to attend the inperson Annual Diversity Summit.

SUSTAINER NEWS

From Socials to volunteering. Our Sustainers always stay busy. The Sustainer Holiday Adopt A Family initiative successfully collected \$1,000 and provided gift cards for grocery stores and Target to support two families. This program, carried out in collaboration with our partners at Family Service League, received heartfelt appreciation from both families. In March, both Sustainers and Actives had a delightful time preparing and savoring a meal featuring Chicken Scarpariello, Polenta, and a delightful Arugula Salad. Additionally, three wonderful raffle baskets were awarded, and the proceeds from these raffles went towards our Legacy Tree!

In collaboration with the Belmont Child Care Association, Inc. (BCCA), our Project Playground initiative took place on Saturday, April 1st, at the Belmont Childcare Association's Anna House in Elmont, NY. Around 40 volunteers came together to assist in installing new playground equipment, painting fences and storage units, and sprucing up the grounds.

BCCA was established to create a child care center at Belmont Park, which hosts the largest population of backstretch workers among the three New York Racing Association, Inc. (NYRA) tracks. Anna House, situated at Belmont Park, is the flagship program of the Belmont Child Care Association, offering comprehensive childcare and early childhood education services. The Project Playground initiative exemplifies what can be achieved when there is a shared commitment to making a positive impact on the lives of children and families in Long Island.

This community partnership underscores the importance of providing safe spaces for children to learn and play. 


